Heard About Campus



Kindergarteners had a wonderful 100th day of school celebration this week. After wrapping up their Arctic and Antarctica studies, kindergarteners are moving onto Asia. Tigers, pandas, and the cultures of Thailand and China are some of the topics in this theme unit.

The 1st and 2nd graders are ending their study of weather this month. They will be learning about the cause of tornadoes, hurricanes, blizzards, and what causes all that electricity in the sky during thunderstorms. As the storms pass by in our unit, they will look at rainbows and how they occur. They will also be "digging" into a new science unit on geology later this month as they learn about the different layers of Earth.

Third and fourth grade students are learning much about California history -- from the establishment of the California missions through the Gold Rush. In preparation for our overnight trip to Sutter's Fort, students are researching and studying a real person who may have been at Sutter's Fort in the 1840s. They will become this character for the duration of our visit to the Fort. We will also be exploring how microorganisms play a part in our everyday life, and how these organisms are tied into the miner's lives of the 1840s by baking, and of course eating, sourdough bread.

Fifth grade students are excited to announce the arrival of Sia, Mrs. Sellu's new baby girl. Mr. Philippi and the fifth graders have smoothly adjusted to each other and are working hard adding, subtracting, and multiplying fractions. They are looking forward to seeing the play "The BFG" in February after they finish reading the book. Science fair projects are in full swing and will be on display at the Chico Science Fair.

February finds Mrs. D.J.'s 6th grade absorbed by Greek Drama! Our play, "Demeter and Persephone" will be performed Thursday, February 25th at 1:30 pm in our classroom partnered with our Greek feast. The FRCS Spelling Bee will be held in our classroom for 4th through 8th graders on Wednesday, February 17th.

Welcome to a fabulous February! The seventh and eighth grade students are headed to Laxson Auditorium on February4th. We will then be visiting the state capitol on February 5th. We are reading individual literature novels and will be creating many different types of traditional and electronic book reports. We are also continuing our year-long inquiry essays. Topics range from cats to the Great Barrier Reef. Math concepts include probability outcomes for seventh grade and compound interest for eighth grade. Science concepts (for 6th grade) will include finishing weather concepts and beginning body systems and cells, including genetics. Seventh graders will study the model of the atom as well as the periodic table. Social studies content is now investigating the circumstances surrounding slavery in our nation's early history.
