Dear Forest Ranch Charter Families,

We are wrapping up the new Smarter Balanced Field Test and things have moved along smoothly. Most of the students have moved through the testing patiently and have tried their best. This new test is a significant shift from how we have assessed students in the past. Students are required to think on a much deeper level, not just recall information. They must provide evidence from multiple sources, be adept at using technology and provide lengthy typed answers to many of the problems. We will continue to create classroom curriculum that will allow them to be more competent in these areas. That being said, some of our students still struggle with basic concepts and are not ready to tackle having things mixed together on a computer-based test quite yet. We will continue to provide rigorous but supportive instruction to help these students meet the changing demands of education, and eventually the workforce, while still honoring the pace and the methods by which they learn best. Please feel free to share with me any observations your children have shared with you or thoughts you have about the new testing. As always, I welcome your feedback.

On another note, we have greatly appreciated the increased response we have received on the Family Surveys this year. Sorry about the few glitches. We have made note of what they were and will work to improve next year. I look forward to seeing all of you at our end of the year events.

#### **Heard About Campus**

Kindergarteners have had a lot of fun learning all about metamorphosis and the life cycle of the butterfly.
